

Welcome to the Front Porch of the Great Outdoors!

When traveling into Morgan County, leave the bustle and stress behind and discover outdoor adventure, unique historic sites and hidden gems lining quaint main streets.

The journey is as pleasant as the destination, with country roads that meander along the Muskingum River and rolling hills. Country roads lead to outdoor adventure, welcoming small towns and a river that played an important role in Ohio's history — all waiting to provide the perfect getaway.

Get On The Water

Spend an enjoyable day exploring the Muskingum River by canoe or kayak. The unique history of the region is what sets this river apart from a number of other Ohio rivers. Treat yourself with Ohio's 160-year-old navigation system which is also a National Historic Civil Engineering Landmark. The 112-mile-long Muskingum River, a tributary of the well-known Ohio River, is a great visual treat. The river served as an essential trade route in the 19th century sealing the historical importance of this region forever.

Kayak and canoe rentals are available at Riversedge Campground & Marina located on the scenic outskirts of Malta.

Kayaks are also available at Burr Oak Getaways located at Dock #2 on Burr Oak Lake. Explore the lake in one of the various watercrafts they have available. From kayaks, to paddle boards, to classic canoeing you're sure to have an enjoyable experience. At both Burr Oak Lake Docks 1 & 4 you will find Burr Oak Marina- another great choice for finding all your watercraft needs. Here you'll find kayaks, canoes, pontoons, and motorboats available for rent, as well as seasonal dock space.

A Hunting and Fishing Paradise

Appalachian Hills Wildlife Area is one of Morgan County's many popular destinations for hunting, fishing, trapping, and other forms of wildlife recreation. Scattered ponds which were created through the reclamation process provide fishing prospects for anglers. The combination of woodland, open areas, and islands of vegetation left undisturbed during the mining process creates transitional zones that provide brushy and reverting fields. These areas are prime habitat components that provide excellent hunting opportunities.

Take A Hike!

With so many opportunities available to take a hiking adventure within Morgan County, you'll be sure to stay active while you're here. The Buckeye Trail and North Country Trail join near Stockport. The majority of the next 110 miles of trail is located off roads on the Buckeye Trail, in the national forest, and on a variety of state, local, and private lands. These trails will treat visitors to some of Ohio's most outstanding scenery.

New to Morgan County is the **Storybook Trail**, which is located near the recreation area and playground at Burr Oak Lodge. The fun hike is a half-mile trail that presents a children's story in segments as it winds through a deciduous forest overlooking the lake. A free library is located near the entrance where visitors may choose to take a book home or leave one for others to enjoy! Those who prefer a more intense workout, Burr Oak has something for you as well. **Lakeview Trail**, which includes **South Shore Trail**, is a 22-mile long moderate to difficult trail which circles the entire lake.

Make your way on over to **Wayne National Forest** to experience **Wildcat Hollow Hiking Trail** which offers two options: a 17.2-mile loop of scenic trail along ridge tops and stream bottoms, and a short, 5-mile loop for day hikes. Both trails will lead through tall pine forests, open meadows, quiet streams, rock outcroppings, and down old roads overlooking miles of beautiful landscapes.

Slip on out to **Lower Muskingum Conservancy-Luke Chute Conservation Area** to experience two miles of walking trails. LMC is a land trust committed to conserving and protecting natural areas in the lower Muskingum River Watershed for all to enjoy. LMC is located on State Route 266, 5 miles from State Route 60 and 5 miles from Stockport.

The **John Hunt Morgan Heritage Trail** follows the 557-mile route of Confederate Brig. Gen. John Hunt Morgan's daring and innovative Great Indiana-Ohio Raid of 1863.

Ready to take a break from all your adventures? Discover the peaceful tranquility of **Black Star Hideaway**. This cozy, private, adults-only cabin is nestled deep inside a valley of 3 wooded acres and built into a hillside in Burr Oak State Park. The park is located inside the beautiful Wayne National Forest.

Black Star Hideaway offers three levels of living space, three sleeping areas, two full baths and sleeps up to 6 adults. The unique design and custom finishes inside create a warm and inviting space that will make you feel right at home the moment you step inside.

The main living area features a full kitchen and living area. Cozy cabin furnishings and huge cornerstone wall with a gas fireplace make it perfect for snuggling up with that special someone on chilly evenings.

You are sure to enjoy a relaxing soak in the hot tub that overlooks the forest or chill out in the evening by the outdoor fire pit. The deck is perfect for sunbathing, relaxing under the umbrella with a good book, or grilling out on a sunny day.















Discover Ohio's natural beauty and history at Ohio State Parks.

A trip to Burr Oak State Park and Lodge offers visitors a chance to blend rustic charm and Ohio history with modern accommodations and unlimited outdoor pursuits. Located in picturesque Morgan County, Burr Oak offers 2,593 acres of wilderness spirit.

Home to some of the state's most beautiful hiking trails, Burr Oak features seven trails including a backpack trail. Twelve miles of the state designated Buckeye Trail runs through the park. Each year, the popular Emma "Grandma" Gatewood Solstice Hike is held at Burr Oak. Gatewood was the first woman to hike the entire length of the Appalachian Trail by herself.

Spend some time at scenic Burr Oak Lake. Multiple boat ramps offer easy access to this unlimited horsepower/no wake speed lake. Relax at the beach, paddle the scenic coves, or jump from your boat into the lake's boat swim areas. Or grab a pole and try your luck at catching largemouth bass, blue gill, or crappie.

To really enjoy all that Burr Oak and the surrounding region offers, an overnight stay is highly recommended. The family campground is pet-friendly and offers electric and non-electric sites. Prefer a fuss-free getaway? Leave the gear at home and try one of the park's seasonal Sherman cabins.

Prefer the comforts of home? The rustic lodge offers modern rooms, a restaurant, and indoor swimming pool. Another popular option is the recently renovated deluxe cabins which are available year-round.

Surrounded by rolling hills, dense woodlands and beautiful skies, Burr Oak State Park is a short drive away from other must-see state parks including Jesse Owens and Muskingum River Parkway state parks. Those lands that are protected as state lands now play a significant role in Ohio's industrial and transportation past.

Also located in Morgan County, one of Ohio's newest state parks, Jesse Owens, offers thousands of acres that are available for fishing, hunting, and camping when combined with the state wildlife area.

Few areas offer more high-quality public lands. Once used for mining, the reclaimed strip-minded land now offers lakes and ponds for fishing, wildlife watching and paddling. The trees planted more than 30 years ago are maturing and provide critical wildlife habitat.

Popular with hunters and anglers, the park offers four primitive camping areas. All sites are free and available on a first-come, first-served basis. Jesse Owens offers campers an authentic back country experience.

While you're at Jesse Owens, make a point to visit the Miner's Memorial Park, which commemorates the men and women who worked for the Central Ohio Coal Company in the 20th century. Mining history comes alive here. One of the main attractions is the "Big Muskie," which is one of the largest draglines (shaped like a huge bucket) that moved more than 483 million cubic yards of material until it was retired in 1991.

Both boaters and history buffs are in for a treat when they visit Muskingum River Parkway, which has been on the National Register of Historic Places since 2001. The lock system is one of America's engineering marvels like the Golden Gate Bridge, Empire State Building or Hoover Dam. In the 19th century, the river's system of locks and dams extended through southern Ohio and helped open the state and the entire Midwest to trade.

The only remaining complete system of hand-operated locks in the United States, these locks are still operated for recreational boaters today. Each lock has its own historical marker. Today, more than 11,000 recreational boaters safely bypass 10 dams on the Muskingum River from Zanesville to the Ohio River in Marietta.

Nine of the 10 locks are still operational; Lock #11 is not in operation but does offer a unique camping experience. Visitors are welcome to stop by and view the lock system from the shore, just as they operated in the 1840s. The locks are operated free of charge for boaters from April through October. A complete lock schedule is available online. To learn more, call the park office at (740) 453-4377.

Adventure Cycling And Gravel Grinding



What is gravel grinding, you ask?

Well, you've come to the right place because in the following article we're going to answer just that question! Charles Scott McDonald has been riding bikes, in one form or another, since he was a little kid. A long-time resident of Morgan County, the routes McDonald took were often on rural, unpaved roads. "I rode my bike everywhere. Both my parents worked, so they were out of the house. If I wanted to go do something, I just jumped on a bike," he said.

As a teenager, he rode BMX (bicycle motocross), but said there weren't any competitions close by which always required him to travel for races. Now a certified coach, he competes in a variety of cycling events around the state and country, including intense 24-hour races, cyclocross and gravel races.

In an interview in 2018 with Bicycling Magazine, McDonald talked about what sparked his competitive cycling career, after a train accident caused him to lose his right arm in the late 1990's. "The doctors put me on narcotics and I gained a lot of weight. I'd always been fit—I once was a runner—and I needed something physical to do for exercise. Some friends were into bikes, so I gave it a shot. Phantom-limb pain causes me a lot of discomfort, and the first thing I noticed

on the bike was just how much better I felt," he said.

McDonald is particularly interested in gravel riding these days, which is pretty much what it sounds like— "mixed surface" cycling that combines elements of road and mountain-biking, and takes place mostly on unpaved roads. Though people have been riding on gravel roads for decades, it is the fastest growing sector, according to a 2018 Outside Magazine article. McDonald participates in an annual gravel race in Emporia, Kansas, called UNBOUND Gravel that now draws over 4,000 riders, but started in 2006 with only 35 participants.

With its proximity to the Baileys Trail System to the south in Athens

County, the ODNR Lands, and the Wayne National Forest surrounding the region, Morgan county is uniquely positioned to serve as a similar outdoor recreation hub.

"I think that the county has always been this hidden outdoor oasis," McDonald said.

He's launched a business called Morgan County Adventure Cycling and plans to lead private coaching sessions and guided tours from his family's property in Ringgold. "We've always come here and trained because Morgan County has over a hundred miles of gravel roads. There's plenty of options to do 20 to 30 plus mile loops without ever crossing a paved road. On our property alone, we're surrounded by seven miles of gravel road; there's over 800 feet of elevation change within that seven miles. We have a 24 mile loop out here that has over a thousand feet of elevation gain," he said.

Though he's been training here for years, McDonald says Morgan County is currently under-utilized by other cyclists. The Ohio Gravel Race Series, which holds 7 unique gravel road races, gets close to Morgan County with a race in Athens,

but McDonald thinks Morgan County would be another prime locale to hold competitions. "We actually have a fairgrounds in McConnelsville, which is tied into the center of all of our gravel roads and event centers. We wouldn't even actually have to add in any infrastructure and we could host a lot of phenomenal events," he said.

He continued, "Cycling's been around for a while. So there's a lot of information out there about the economic impact. There's a lot of interest in this kind of development—outdoor recreation offers huge economic opportunities. Plus we get to preserve the land".

With the recent surge in interest in cycling as a whole, due in part to the COVID-19 pandemic, combined with the potential economic and positive environmental impact, and the geographic location, McDonald thinks he has a winning combination. "We're a short drive from Columbus. It's a short drive from Zanesville. It's not too far from Cincinnati. We're really interested in being a conduit. One of the things missing in the area is folks with knowledge and experience of the cycling industry. I feel that we at Morgan County Adventure Cycling can be a strong advocate and provide resources for education around cycling. The neat thing about this area is there's something for everybody to do," he said.





McConnelsville

Now that you have the basic necessities of a great vacation covered- outdoor recreation, dining and shopping, let's dig a little deeper into the communities that make up the whole of Morgan County starting with McConnelsville, the county seat. Residents named the town after Robert McConnel, one of the community's earliest residents. The first settlers originally called the village Old Town, which was inhabited in 1817.

McConnelsville grew relatively quickly, having a population of 957 people in 1840. The community's location on the Muskingum River helped spur this growth. By 1846, the town contained five churches, fifteen stores, two newspaper offices, one iron foundry, two flourmills, and one woolen factory.

In 1880, McConnelsville had 1,473 residents, with nearly one-third of the people being school-aged children. In 1886, the town boasted eight churches, two newspaper offices, and one bank. Several manufacturing businesses existed in the com-

munity, with most of them providing services or products to farmers in the surrounding countryside. The town's largest manufacturer was George P. Hann, who employed sixteen residents in the making of cigars.

McConnelsville remained relatively small throughout the twentieth century and today has a population of approximately 2500. Our Main Street is lined with beautiful homes, locally owned retails shops and restaurants and the charm of a small town radiates throughout the community.

Our proud history is still on display and can be experienced at our **Morgan County Historical Society Museum** located front and center of Main Street, along with her sister properties, **The Doll House**, **The Carriage House**, and **The Evelyn True Button House**.

Just a few steps away from the museums you'll find one of our many great places to overnight.

Comprised of the Stone House and Morris House, **The Inns at 8th and Main** is a traditional, boutique bed and breakfast located on historic, Main Street, McConnelsville. It is where history and luxury meet.

The Inns at 8th and Main is distinguished by fine food, luxury amenities, and warm-hearted hospitality. Enjoy all the amenities of a traditional bed and breakfast where you are greeted as guests but leave as friends.

You'll find the five, luxurious guest rooms characterful and classic, but never old-fashioned. All rooms feature luxury amenities.

When you stay at The Inns, a leisurely, home-style breakfast is served in the historic Stone House dining room. They are generous in portion and include one of two main course options- one sweet and one savory. The breakfast menu is planned daily with local farm-fresh eggs, meats, and produce.

The **Rock Hollow School** is a one-room school that was re-located to its present location on Main Street in Malta, by the Morgan County Historical Society. Rock Hollow School was originally built in 1877 in a wooded ravine two miles south of Ringgold, Union Township, and housed classes for 57 years. The first class was held in November 1877. The school is furnished and equipped just as it was when it was still in use in the late 19th century.

Tucked away in a beautiful country setting is the **Sugar Pear Cottage**. Adorned with a gorgeous view, this getaway cottage offers plenty of parking, a spacious patio with a fire pit, grill, and outdoor dining space. Modern-country décor sets this cottage apart from the norm and is sure to leave you with lasting memories! The **Morgan County Dungeon** was discovered in 1964 during excavation for the present sheriff's office and jail. Located beneath the basement in the old jail, the dungeon contained several artifacts and is a stark reminder of how criminals were dealt with in the 19th century. Prisoners convicted of rioting, larceny and adultery in Morgan County between 1833 and 1839 were confined to the dungeon.



Stockport

Stockport is a river town steeped in history and immersed with a people proud of their community's heritage. This charming, old-world village offers rich history you'll not want to miss. You'll want to take in the rich history of **Big Bottom Memorial Park**. Named for the broad Muskingum River flood plain, this is the site of a raid by about 25 Delaware and Wyandot warriors on Ohio Company settlements on January 2, 1791. The American Indians were attempting to halt the encroachment of European-Americans onto their tribal lands. The raid outraged the United States government and led to four years of bitter warfare, which ended with the defeat of the tribal coalition at the Battle of Fallen Timbers and the signing of the Treaty of Green Ville. At Big Bottom Memorial Park, you will find a 12-foot marble obelisk which marks the site of the attack.

After you've taken in all the park has to offer, be sure to make your way over the bridge and dam to the historic Stockport Mill.

The historic **Stockport Mill Inn**, once a grist (grain) mill, used hydro electricity for processing grain into flour. Today the Mill still harnesses the energy of the Muskingum River to generate power for the Mill's hotel and restaurant.


Great care has been taken to preserve the original integrity of the Mill. Each of the 14 distinctive guest rooms, with private balconies, offer commanding views of the river and dam at Lock #6. The roar of the mighty Muskingum is an exhilarating experience.

Your host, Dottie, will be sure your hotel stay, dining or event is a memorable one.












Founded by the Quakers and built in 1908, the **Union Hall Theater** is located on the second floor of the **Union Hall Building** in Chesterhill. 













Jesse Owen State Park and Appalachian Hills Wildlife Area

Attractions

Many unique and historic attractions can be found in Morgan County.

For a unique glimpse into Ohio history, stop at **The Miner's Memorial Park**, which commemorates AEP and Central Ohio Coal Company employees on the Wall of Honor.

The highlight of the memorial is the **Big Muskie Bucket**, part of the largest dragline ever built. The Big Muskie was a massive feat of engineering. From 1969 to 1991 it moved more than 483 million cubic yards of overburden to uncover the Ohio brown coal. Although the Big Muskie is now at rest, visitors can imagine its great size when they stand within the bucket walls.

Visitors can learn more about Morgan County's early years at the **Morgan County Historical Society Museum** and at several satellite exhibits and buildings both in town and in neighboring Malta.

On the river, check out Lock #7, located right in McConnelsville, and learn more about this fascinating aspect of river travel. See for yourself the **Muskingum River Lock and Dam System**, the last remaining hand operated lock and dam system in the United States.

Discovering the past can be so intriguing! Morgan County is home to five historic covered bridges. Stop by the visitor center to pick up your copy of the **Covered Bridge Trail** and set out for a relaxing drive on our scenic back roads!

Speaking of scenic, the **Appalachian Byway** follows SR 78 from Clarington through Monroe, Noble, Morgan, and Athens counties ending in Nelsonville. It also included a short portion north on SR 284 to **The Wilds** in Muskingum County.

As you discovered earlier in the guide, Morgan County is home to many different types of attractions. Check out their listings for details about the websites, Facebook pages, and other ways to contact them to help make plans for your next visit!


